ON THE IDAHO STANDARDS ACHIEVEMENT TEST IN ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS/LITERACY AND MATHEMATICS

Your student's score report for the 2023 Idaho Standards Achievement Test (ISAT) in English Language Arts (ELA)/Literacy and Mathematics provides your family with useful information, including:

- How your student scored on end-of-year, statewide assessments in ELA/Literacy and Mathematics
- Whether these scores meet Idaho's standards for achievement
- How your student's scores compare with students in the same school, the same district, and across Idaho

This brochure provides you with guidance on understanding the score report, answers a few frequently asked questions about the assessment, and offers direction on where to go to find additional resources.

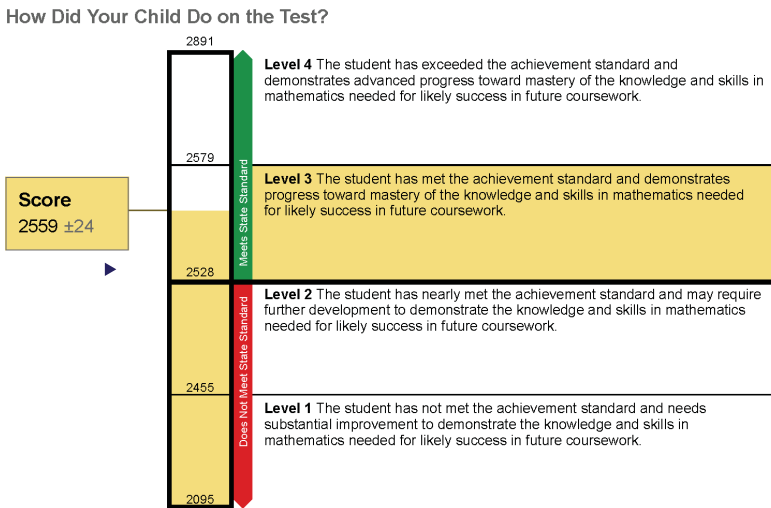

YOUR STUDENT'S ISAT SCORE
The main graphic on the report shows your student's scale score and where it falls on the four ISAT achievement levels. This information is also summarized at the top of the report.

Level 4 indicates your student has **exceeded** achievement standards.

Level 3 indicates your student has **met** achievement standards.

Level 2 indicates your student has **nearly met** achievement standards.

Level 1 indicates your student has **not met** achievement standards.

These scores are just one piece of information about your student's academic performance, but serve as important measures of progress.

COMPARISON SCORES

Information on Standard Error of Measurement

A student's score is best interpreted when recognizing that the student's knowledge and skills fall within a score range and not just a precise number. For example, 2300 (±30) indicates a score range between 2270 and 2330.

Quantile® Information

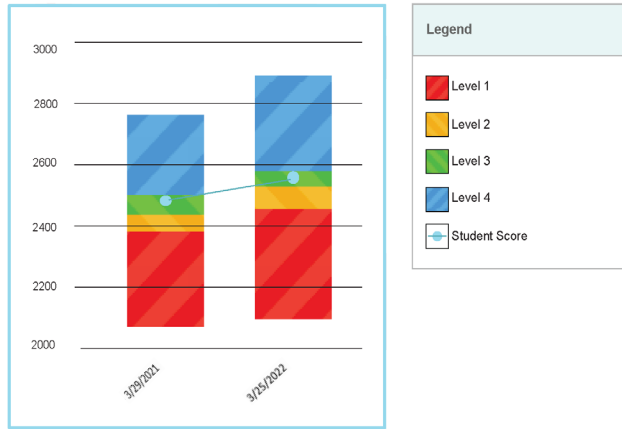
The Quantile® Framework for Mathematics is a scientific approach to measuring mathematical achievement and mathematical skills and concepts. There are two Quantile measures: the Quantile student measure and the Quantile skill and concept measure. A Quantile student measure represents a person's mathematical ability on the Quantile scale. A Quantile skill or concept measure represents that skill or concept's difficulty level on the Quantile scale. When used together, they can help a student determine his or her readiness to learn new mathematical skills and concepts. The chart below reports your child's performance over time. The shaded areas in multiple colors indicate the scale score range in each achievement level. Each mark on the graph represents your child's score and indicates whether he or she met the standards that year. Please note that a scale score from Spring 2020 summative testing is not included on the graph. A waiver for summative testing in Spring 2020 was granted by the U.S. Department of Education.

Explanatory	5 out of 10 points	The explanatory response shows a partial understanding of correct sentence formation, punctuation, capitalization, grammar usage, and spelling. (1 out of 2 points)	The explanatory response provides uneven elaboration to support the topic or controlling idea including few facts and details cited from sources, weak elaborative techniques and ineffective language for the audience and purpose. (2 out of 4 points)	The explanatory response has an inconsistent structure including an unclear topic or controlling idea, uneven development, few transitions, and loosely connected ideas. If present, the introduction and conclusion may be weak. (2 out of 4 points)

How do these scores affect my student?

The Spring ISAT assessments in ELA/Literacy and Mathematics are not intended to affect your student's report card or ability to move on to the next grade level. We primarily use performance on the ISAT in ELA/Literacy and Mathematics to help families, schools, districts, and the state understand and improve student academic achievement in Idaho.

What grade levels participated in the ISAT ELA/Literacy and Mathematics assessments?

Students in grades 3-8 and 11 participated in the Spring 2023 ISAT in ELA/Literacy and Mathematics.
